



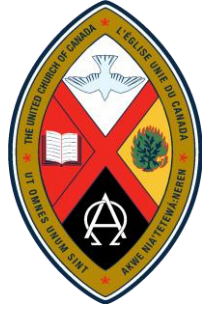

A STORY FOR THE AGES

(Lectionary@Home: Exodus 17:1-7 Psalm 78:1-4,12-16
Philippians 2:1-13 Matthew 21:23-32)

FOCUS READINGS: Exodus 17:1-7 (Based on The Voice)

Reader: The entire community of Israel travelled in stages out of the desert of Sin, just as the Eternal instructed. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water there to quench their thirst. *Once again*, the people complained to Moses.

Congregation: Give us water to drink! *We're thirsty.*

Reader: Why do you aim your complaints at me? Why are you testing the Eternal One? But the people were so thirsty for water, they complained to Moses *and leveled accusations against him.*

Congregation: Why did you lead us out of Egypt? Was it to kill *all of us*—our children and livestock included—with this thirst?

Reader: In these words, the Holy becomes known.

Many: Thanks be to God.

SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

ONE: Heaven declares God's glory.
